INVESTING IN CANADA PLAN



Of the \$180+ billion, 12-year Investing in Canada Plan, **\$10.1 billion** has been dedicated to trade and transportation, including:

- \$5 billion for the Canada Infrastructure Bank to invest in trade and transportation; and
- \$2 billion for the National Trade Corridors Fund (NTCF).

NTCF OVERVIEW

\$2 billion, 11-year, competitive, merit-based program to:

- Build stronger, more resilient, and more efficient transportation corridors to international markets
- Help Canadian business to compete, grow and create jobs
- Support investments in critical transportation needs in the territories with up to \$400 million dedicated to the North



FIRST CALL FOR PROPOSALS



NTCF design is informed by consultations and lessons from past programs

- Using **competitive**, **merit-based processes**: first call for proposals in 2017 to address immediate issues and develop a "project pipeline"
- **Targeting investments** to assets that support economic activity and trade flows: Canada's economic health correlates with trade success
- Strengthening reliability and **resilience to climate change** and extreme weather
- Leveraging: multiplies impacts and broadens support for projects

ANNOUNCED PROJECTS

 More than \$770 million in federal funding has been announced for 37 projects, located in each province and territory, including highways, ports, short-line railways, grade separations, and airports




ANNOUNCED PROJECTS IN THE WEST AND NORTH




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CASE STUDY: VANCOUVER



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\$604.8 million (\$222.9 million from the NTCF) for 7 projects to build initial priorities from the Greater Vancouver Gateway 2030 Vision for Trade Growth

MOVING FORWARD

- The second call for proposals will target projects in Yukon, Northwest Territories and Nunavut as part of the NTCF's \$400 M allocation to address the unique transportation needs of the North
 - Anticipated launch later this year
 - \$255 M of the dedicated northern funding remains unallocated, after
 \$145 M was committed to four projects in the North under the first call
 - Priorities may include: strengthening efficiency and safety of air and marine services, promoting climate change resilience and mitigation, and fostering new economic development opportunities (e.g., mining, fisheries, tourism)
- Future calls will be informed by priority-setting exercises
 - Regional assessments of trade and transportation infrastructure needs will leverage Transport Canada's growing evidence base of data and analysis
 - Related tools developed under the Investing in Canada Plan (e.g., Green Lens) or broader initiatives (e.g., Arctic and Northern Policy Framework)
