# Animal Agriculture

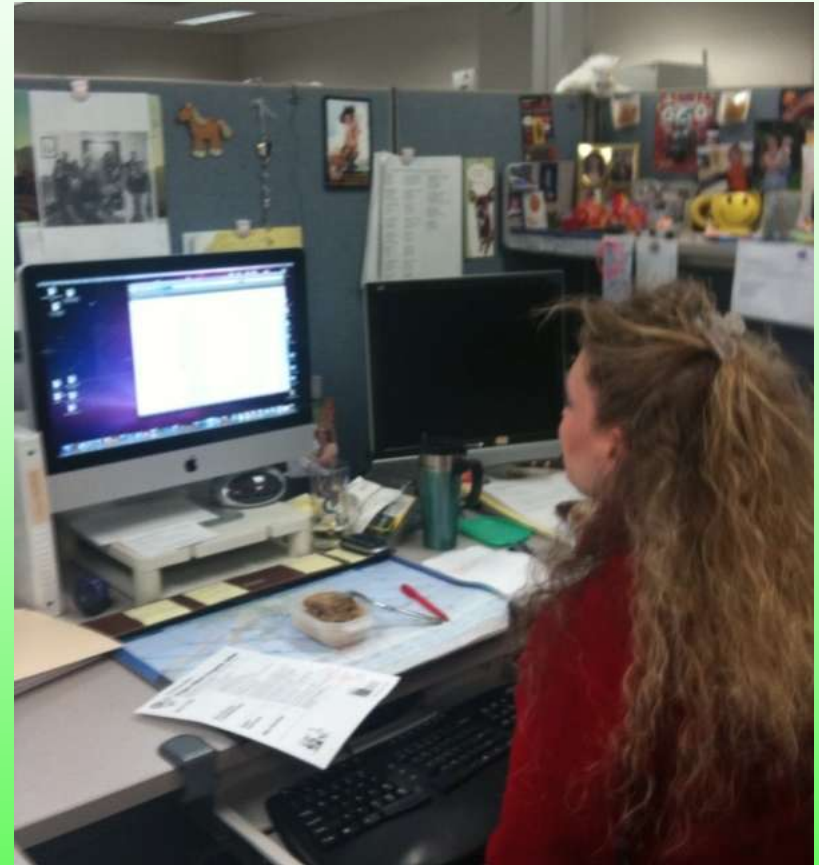


- Contributes more than \$1.1 billion to state's economy
- Represents 25.3% of the total income from all Oregon agriculture commodities

# Potential Disease Risk to the State's Livestock

Every year we issue  
import permits for

- >140,000 cattle
- >120,000 lambs
- >100,000 pigs
- >27,000 poultry
- >14,000 horses



# Animal Movements

- More than 1,000,000 cattle are exported and/or change ownership annually
- More than 250,000 sheep are exported annually

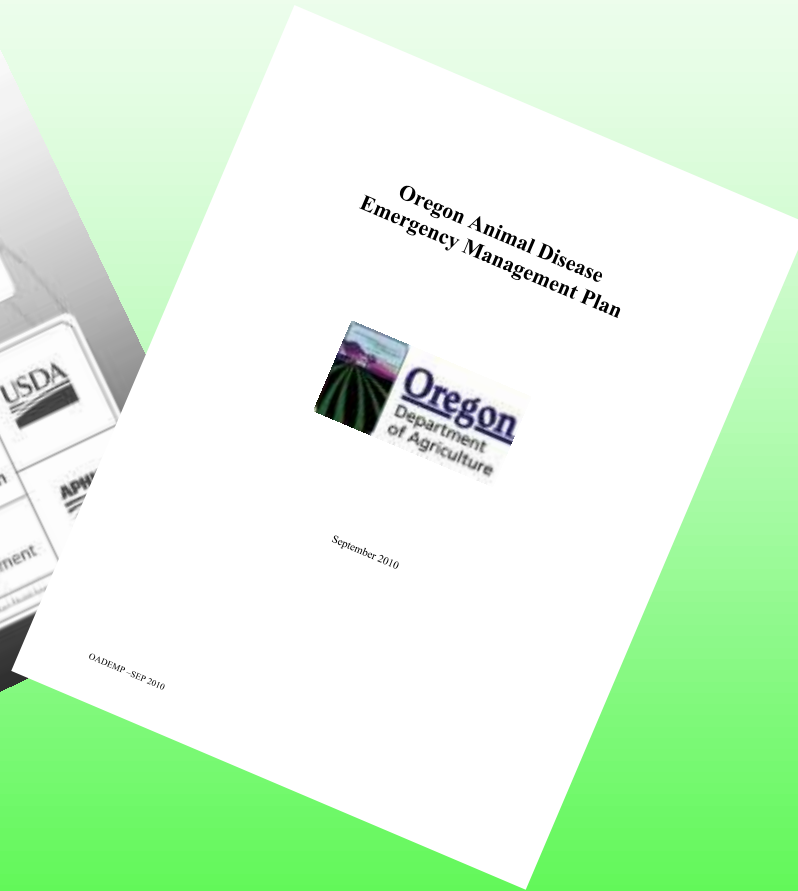


# We regularly train for response to an emergency disease event

- We have state and federal veterinarians specifically trained as FADDs to respond to FAD suspect cases
- We have a cadre of 140 veterinarians and techs who are trained to be 1<sup>st</sup> responders to an animal disease event such as FMD.



# We have protocols for response to an emergency disease event



# State's Initial Response

- All vesicular lesions are reportable including FMD
- Initial report most likely to State Vet from private vet
- Private vet would place a quarantine on premises
- State Vet and State's USDA- AVIC would send out closest FADD



# Initial response cont....

- FADD assesses animals, collects more epi data and samples
- Samples transported to state NAHLN lab and to FADDL lab on Plum Island
- Advises AVIC and State Vet of potential trace outs and contacts



# Initial Cont'd....

- Following state's response plan, State Vet advises Agency Director, Governor's office and State Emergency Manager of potential for emergency disease event



# Post Confirmation

- FADDL reports to AVIC who informs SV
- SV activates emergency call system
  - Director
  - Governor
  - County EM
  - State EM
- State EM opens State EOC
  - State police
  - Dept. of Transportation
  - Public Health
  - Dept. Environmental Quality
  - Liaison for National Guard
  - Others as required



# Post Confirm....

- Vet Response Team alerted
- Agency EOC opened
- Neighboring States/Provinces advised
- Initial quarantine expanded ASAP
- ICS put in place at local level and Unified Command System at state level
- State Veterinary staff to support at all levels
- Director/State Vet take lead in working with industry and securing/maintaining their support
