- 100 years forward

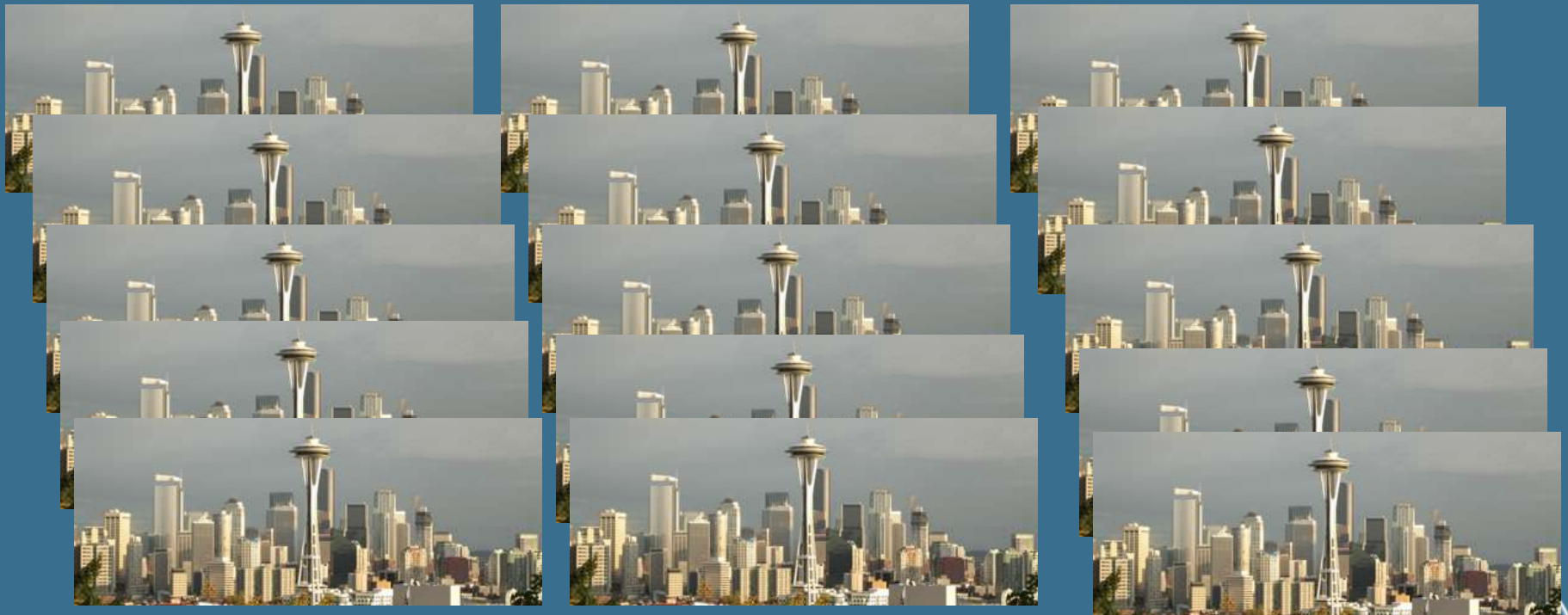
Thinking broad

Our Challenge

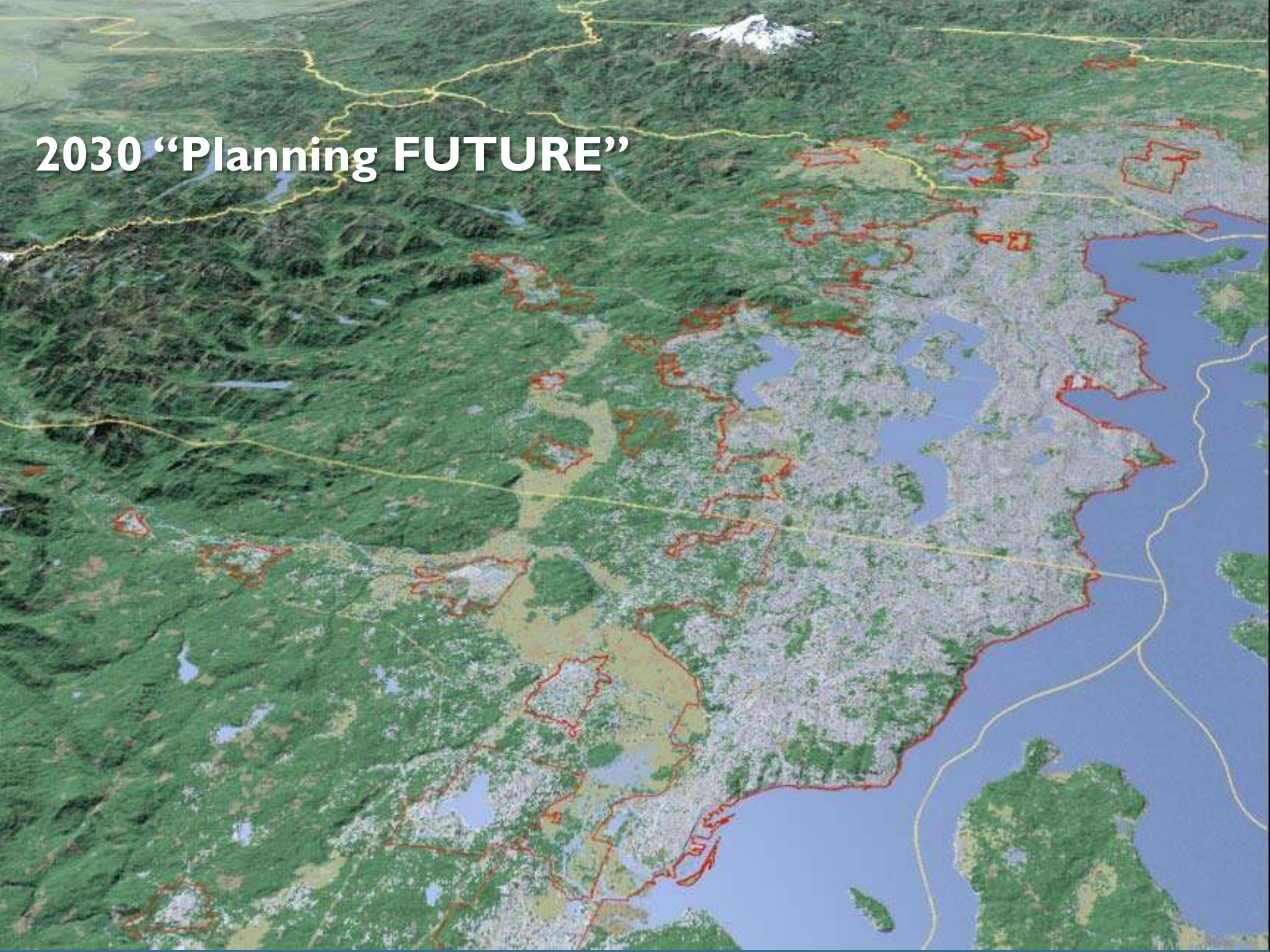
- In the next 100 years the Puget Sound Basin will experience population growth equivalent to 15 cities the size of Seattle.

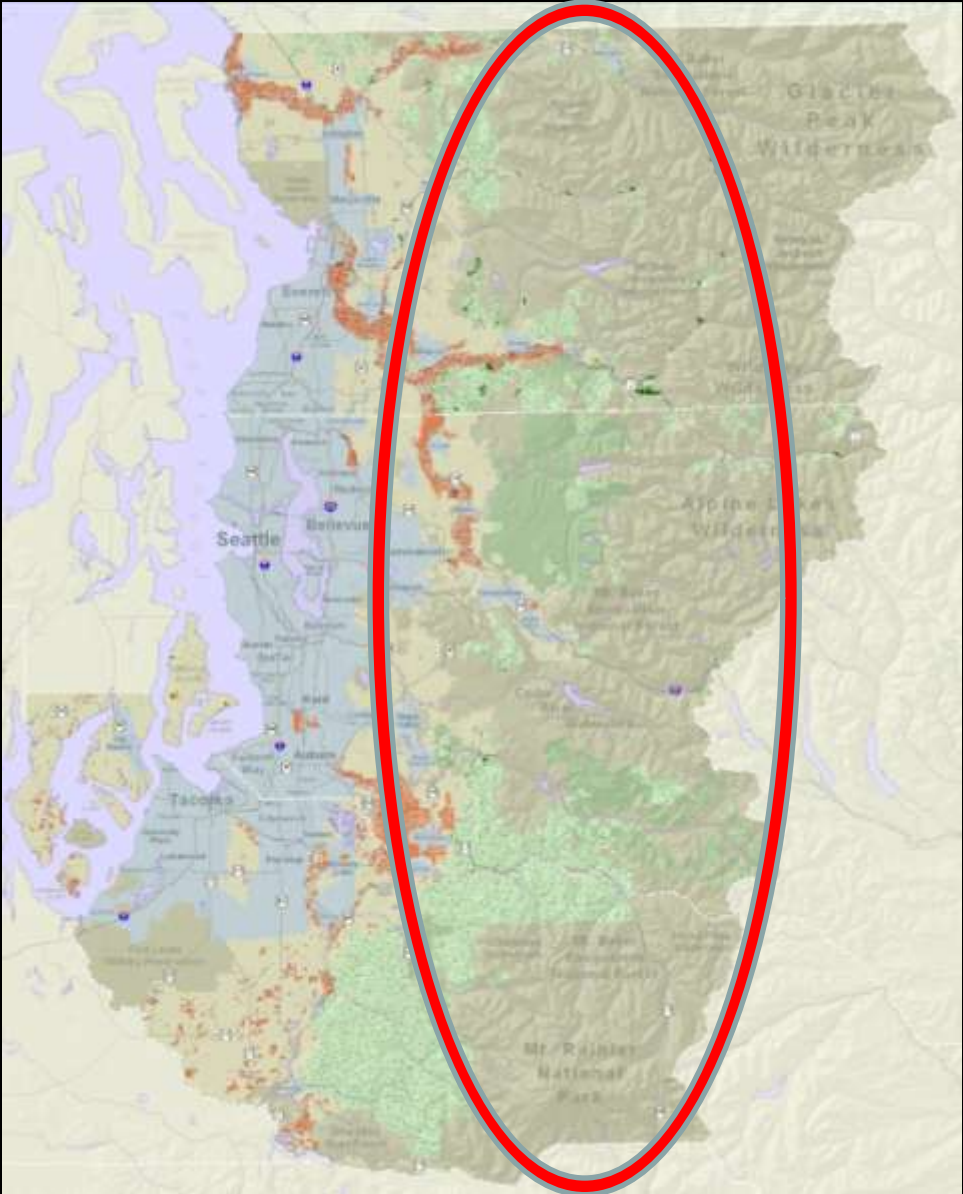

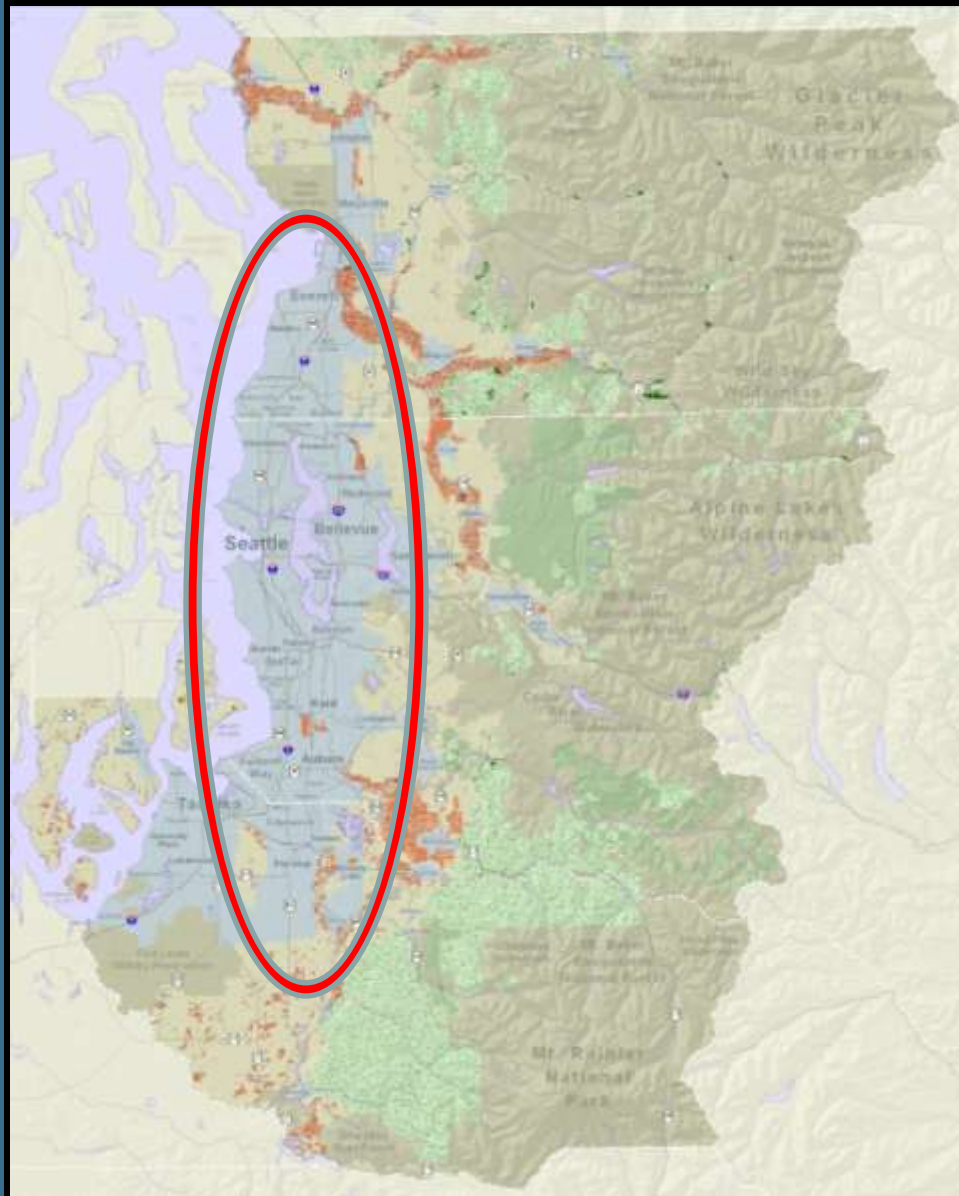

Get smart: great schools and educational opportunities

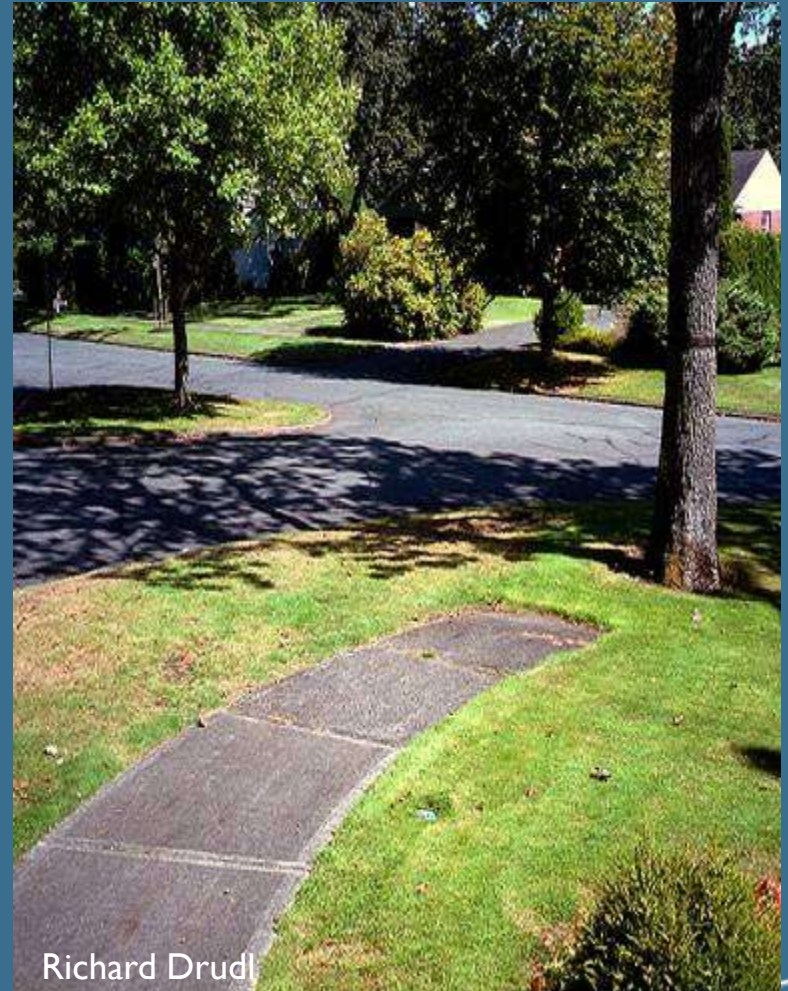
Get around: variety of transportation choices

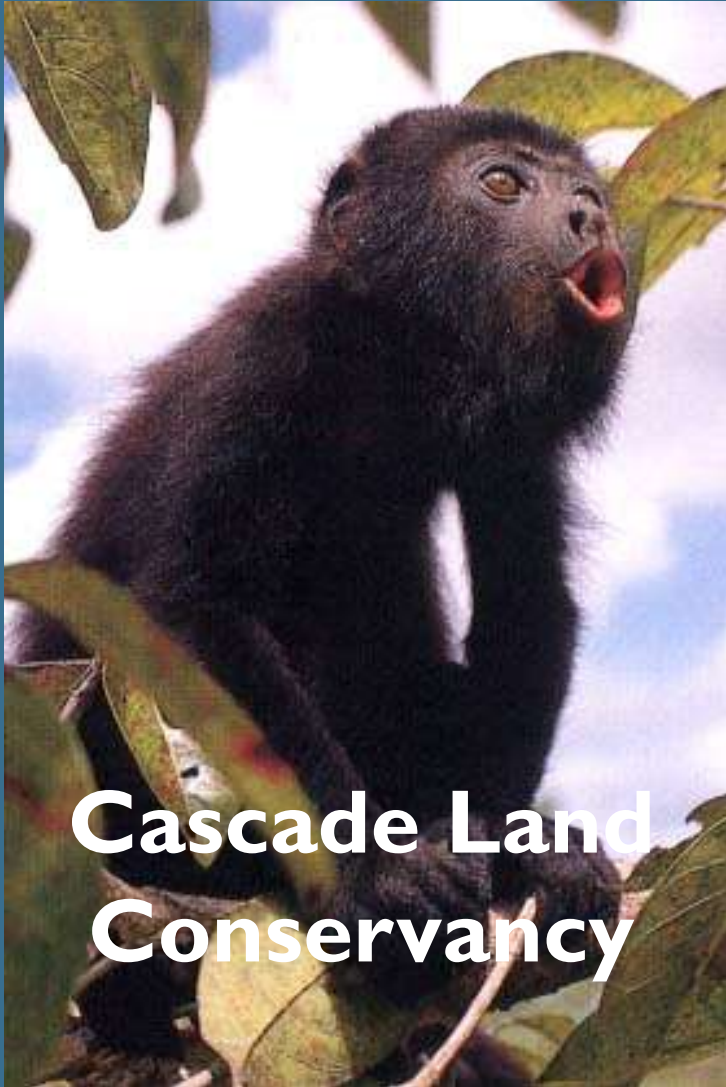

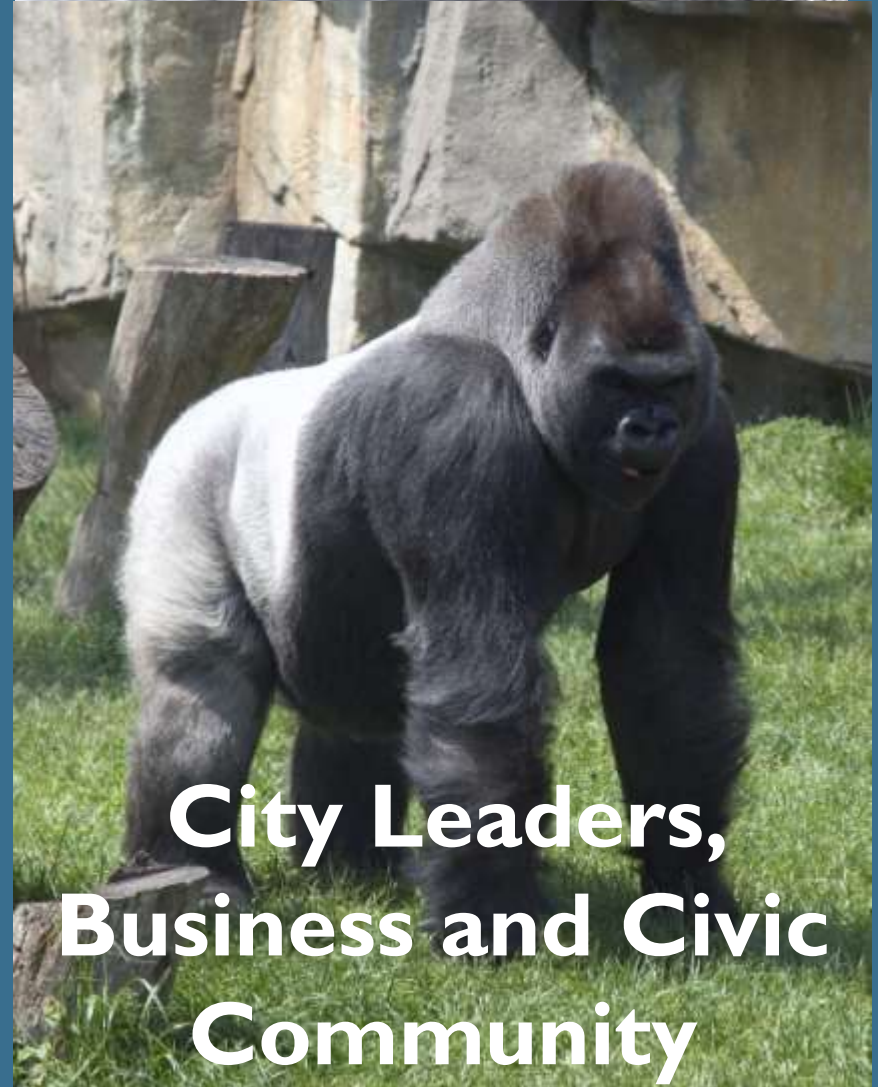
