


PNWER Invasive Species Working Group

- Potential cost of an invasive mussel introduction into the Pacific Northwest has been estimated at more than
 \$500M annually.
- PNWER and regional partners have been instrumental in establishing the federal grant program providing 1:1
 match to the NW States through the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) in 2014.
- These matching funds managed by PSMFC have allowed for a doubling of watercraft inspection effort in Idaho,
 Montana, Oregon and Washington, resulting in a reduced threat of a quagga mussel invasion to the region.
- Currently nearly \$28M in U.S. Federal funding has come through this U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) program.

PNWER Invasive Species Working Group

- The 2018 WRDA added more basins to the list of states that can apply for the funds. The number of eligible states increased from 4 to 16, encompassing most of the Western U.S. including and beyond the Columbia River Basin.
- The FY2020 appropriation was increased from \$6M to \$18M, and the allocation of funds is distributed by USACE Walla Walla District. Still awaiting the revised letter report that allocates the funding to states
- PNWER and regional partners support the continued funding of this program and need your support.
- Currently PNWER is exploring a potential MOU between USACE and Canadian Provinces
