

#### **Public and Private Sector Leadership**

PNWER delivers results on regional issues through action plans developed by more than fourteen working groups corresponding to the region's key priorities. Each working group is co-chaired by an industry leader and legislator. Founded in 1991, PNWER is the only statutory, non-partisan, non-profit, bi-national, public/private partnership in North America. PNWER is the forum for collaborative bi-national planning involving both the public and private sectors and offers leadership at the state/provincial level in Salem, Olympia, Boise, Helena, Junuea, Edmonton, Victoria and Whitehorse, and at the national level in Washington, DC and Ottawa

#### 2010 Winter Olympics



PNWER has established a 2010 Coordinating Council to develop a regional business plan to market the Pacific Northwest to the world, facilitate business opportunities and promote the region as a destination before, during and after the Games. PNWER is also working with partners to increase pulic understanding of border-crossing requirements and establishing a regional presence at the Games.

#### Workforce




Over the next ten years, the region will attract over US \$250 billion in investment capital for some of the world's largest projects, including the Mackenzie Valley and Alaska Natural Gas Pipelines, the Alberta Oil Sands and the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver. Taking advantage of these major economic development opportunities will require a great deal of bi-national cooperation and coordination. PNWER has established a Workforce Development Task Force to ensure that we have the resources and skilled workforce to turn opportunities into true econnomic prosperity.

#### **Energy**



PNWER has been tasked by the US Department of Energy to develop a bi-national Pacific NW Energy Planning Council. Industry representatives, provincial energy ministers and legislative energy com- goals include: mittee chairmen come together to address key issues in energy planning across jurisdictional and national boundaries, with an emphasis on multi-jurisdictional citing and permitting. PNWER's Energy Horizon project has recently conducted a study on the cost of not building transmission and is developing tools for policy makers on key energy issues and is conducting the 1st Legislative Energy Institute in 2009.

## **Border Coordination Council**



In 2008, PNWER launched the Border Coordination Council made up of public and private stakeholders committed to reducing border costs and strengthening security. The Council's goals include:

Providing consistent input on regional priorities from governments, stakholders, and border communities in the Pacific Northwest; help shape border security policy and implementation strategies; connect the federal governments in a systematic way with local impacts of border decisions. PNWER held a Regional Solutions Border Conference in Washington D.C. in February 2009 at the Woodrow Wilson Center.

#### PNW Innovation Network



The Pacific Northwest is fortunate to have a vibrant. entreprenuerial economy, rich with global talent and innovative organizations. PNWER is working to develop the Pacific NorthWest Innovation Network: a new forum for Canadian and American academia, business across sectors and investors to collaborate and engage in an action-oriented dialogue on key R&D-related issues and opportunities in the Pacific Northwest.

#### **Developing the Work Plan**

#### **Issues**

PNWER Officers meet with government and legistlative leadership during legislative sessions to investigate key regional cross border issues. These issues as well as others suggested by members of the working group, co-chairs, the Executive Committee or member jurisdictions help form each working group's agenda for the Annual Summit.

#### **Working Groups**

Each working group is chaired by a public and private sector leader. Working groups generally address key issues identified through the regional process from the past year. During the Summit, working groups are briefed by subject matter experts then discuss issues presented. Working Groups are asked to develop action items and project teams to work beyond the meeting to carry out recommendations.

#### **Action Items and Resolutions**

Working groups develop action items and resolutions after each session during the summit, which are forwarded to the Executive Committee for approval. Resolutions are generally developed to address specific policy objectives and may be forwarded to state/provincial legistlatures for introduction in the next session. Action items generally involve identifying projects and teams to address specific issues identified during the working group session.

#### **Executive Committees**

Actions Items and Resolutions are submitted by each working group for approval from the Executive Committees. The Committee may send items back to the Working Group for clarification or revision.

#### The Work Plan

Once approved, the Working Group Action Items and Resolutions become the PNWER Work Plan. The PNWER Secretariat assists working groups and project teams to execute the work plan. PNWER Officers will also travel to each state and provincial capital as well as visit Ottawa and Washington DC to raise specific issues from the workplan.

## 10 Keynote Speakers



#### **David Bieter, Boise Mayor**

David H. Bieter was first elected in 2007. He has made protecting the city's livability the centerpiece of his administration. He was born and raised in Boise and holds a B.A. in International Studies from the College of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota and a Juris Doctorate from the University of Idaho College of law. He earned experience in municipal affairs as civil counsel to Bonner County in Sandpoint, as civil prosecutor and land use specialist in the Ada County Prosecutor's office and later as a private attorney.

He was chosen to assume his father's seat in the Idaho House of Representatives after his parents, Pat and Eloise Bieter, were killed in an automobile accident in 1999. Voters elected him to full terms in 2000 and 2002.



#### Walt Minnick Congressman, Idaho

Walter C. "Walt" Minnick is serving in his first term as the Congressman from Idaho's First Congressional District. He took the oath of office for the 111th Congress on January 6, 2009

Walt serves on the House Agriculture Committee, where he helps craft policy for Idaho farmers and where he helps oversee the U.S. Forest Service lands throughout Idaho and the west. Walt also serves on the House Financial Services Committee, where he helps craft the

nation's economic policy and regulations. Both committees fit well into Walt's focuses on crafting a sensible, consensus-based approach to public lands, improving care and services for veterans, and creating more goodpaying jobs here in Idaho.

Walt grew up near Walla Walla, Washington, on his family's dryland wheat farm. He earned an economics degree from Whitman College in his hometown before moving east. He graduated from Harvard Business School and Harvard Law School, and spent two years in the U.S. Army. From there he went to work in the White House Office of Management and Budget, but resigned from the Nixon Administration in protest the day after the president fired a special prosecutor investigating the Watergate burglary.



#### John van Dongen, MLA British Columbia and PNWER President

John van Dongen was re-elected as MLA to serve the new riding of Abbotsford-South in the spring of 2009. John was first elected in 1995 in a by-election to represent the riding of Abbotsford and was re-elected in 1996, 2001, and 2005. Mr. van Dongen currently serves as the Government Caucus Whip. He also serves as the current President of the Pacific Northwest Economic Region (PNWER).

Mr. van Dongen has served as the Solicitor General and Minister of Public Safety. He has also served as Minister of State for Intergovernmental Relations and as Minister of Agriculture, Food and Fisheries. He has also been a member of the Government Caucus Committee on Social Development. For the past several years, John served on the Hospital Construction Committee for the new Abbotsford Hospital and Cancer Centre.

Before his election to the Legislative Assembly, Mr. van Dongen operated a dairy farm in Abbotsford. He studied agricultural economics at the University of British Columbia.



#### Roger D. Woodworth, Vice President, Sustainable Energy Solutions, Avista Utilities

Roger Woodworth is vice president for Avista Corp. and vice president for Sustainable Energy Solutions for Avista Utilities. Woodworth received his Bachelor of Science degree in wildlife biology from Washington State University in 1978. He is also an alumnus of Columbia University's Senior Executive Program.

Woodworth began his career at Avista Corp. as a fish and wildlife biologist in 1979. He chairs the President's Advisory Council for Washington State University-Spokane. He is a director on the board and past chair of Foundation Northwest, a non-profit community foundation. He serves on the Electric Power Research Institute's executive steering committee for energy efficiency initiatives, chairs Edison Electric Institute's customer service executive advisory committee, and he is vice chair of the board of the Northwest Energy Efficiency Alliance. In addition, Woodworth chairs the Mayor's Task Force on Sustainability in Spokane, Wash.

## Keynote Speakers



#### C.L. "Butch" Otter, Idaho Governor

C.L. "Butch" Otter was elected Governor of Idaho on November 7, 2006. He previously served three terms in Congress representing Idaho's 1st District (2000-2006). Governor Otter is a father of four and grandfather of five. He is married to the former Lori Easley of Kimberly. They live on their ranch near Star.

Governor Otter was born in Caldwell on May 3, 1942. He graduated from St. Teresa's Academy (now Bishop Kelly High School) in Boise, attended Boise Junior College (now Boise State University), and received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from the College of Idaho in 1967. He served honorably in the Idaho Army National Guard's

116th Armored Cavalry from 1968 to 1973, and later was awarded honorary doctorates from the University of the Philippines and the College of Idaho in Caldwell.

Governor Otter's 30-year career in business included membership on the Board of Directors of the J.R. Simplot Company. He also served as Director of the Food Products Division, President of Simplot Livestock, and President of Simplot International. He retired in 1993.

When he was elected to Congress, Governor Otter was serving his fourth term as Idaho's Lieutenant Governor. He served in that office longer than anyone in Idaho history. He previously represented the people of Canyon County in the Idaho House of Representatives for two terms (1973-1976), was on the Idaho Republican Party Central Committee and was Chairman of the Canyon County Republican Party.



#### Dean C. Allen, Chief Executive Officer, McKinstry

Dean has over 30 years experience in the design, construction, and real estate industries of the Pacific Northwest. Through his vision as President and CEO, McKinstry has grown from a mechanical contractor into a comprehensive design, build, operate, and maintain enterprise with over \$350 million per year in revenues and over 1,600 employees. Dean has served the community in a variety of industry and philanthropic roles. He currently serves on the boards of the Seattle Biomedical Research Institute, Global Partnerships, PATH, and Seattle Children's Hospital and Regional Medical Center. He also serves on the Washington Roundtable and the Partnership for Learning.

Dean holds Bachelor of Science degrees in Biochemistry and Psychology from the University of Washington where he graduated magna cum laude.



#### The Honourable Gary Lunn, Canadian Minister of State for Sport

First elected to the House of Commons in 1997, Gary Lunn was re-elected in 2000, 2004, 2006, and 2008. After serving as Minister of Natural Resources from February 2006 to October 2008, he was appointed Minister Responsible for Sport and the 2010 Vancouver-Whistler Olympics and Paralympics on October 30, 2008.

Minister Lunn is a strong advocate for amateur sport in Canada, and is a former member of the Canadian Ski Patrol. He welcomes the challenge of being Minister of State for Sport as Canada prepares to welcome the world at the Vancouver Winter Olympics and Paralympics in 2010.

Prior to entering federal politics, Minister Lunn practiced law in Victoria and is a member of the British Columbia Law Society. He has previously worked in the mining and forestry industries of British Columbia and northern Canada. He is a certified carpenter, and has taught first aid for St. John's Ambulance. Gary resides in North Saanich with his wife, Alexis and their two children, David and Victoria.

Stephen P. Reynolds, President and Chief Executive Officer, Puget Sound Energy Stephen Reynolds has three decades of experience in both the natural gas and electric power business, including significant accomplishments in energy matters at the state and federal levels in North America and internationally. He was formerly CEO of Reynolds Energy International and served for 10 years as CEO of Pacific Gas Transmission Company of Portland, Oregon.

Reynolds is also committed to strengthening company relationships with customers, regulators, industry peers, employees, and other key constituencies. In addition to his responsibilities with Puget Energy and PSE, Reynolds serves on the boards of directors for: ArtsFund, The 5th Avenue Theatre, The Performing Arts Center Eastside, The Nature Conservancy of Washington, Washington Roundtable, Green Diamond Resources Company, Intermec, Inc., the Edison Electric Institute, and the American Gas Association.

A California native, Reynolds has a bachelor's degree in Economics from the University of California-Berkeley, and a master's in Business Administration from the University of Oregon.



#### Douglas P. Bloom, President, Spectra Energy Transmission West

Doug Bloom is president of Spectra Energy Transmission's western Canadian operations, responsible for four of the company's western-based divisions: BC Pipeline, BC Field Services, Midstream and the Natural Gas Liquids division.

Bloom joined the company in 1987 as a regulatory affairs supervisor for Westcoast Energy in Vancouver. Since then he has held a series of leadership positions of increasing responsibility including: information technology, regulated businesses and marketing. Most recently, he

served as president of Maritimes and Northeast Pipeline. Bloom holds bachelor's and master's degrees in economics, both from Simon Fraser University in Burnaby, British Columbia.



#### Stephen J. (Steve) Wright, Administrator, Bonneville Power Administration

Steve Wright was appointed Administrator of the Bonneville Power Administration on Jan. 24, 2002. Prior to his appointment as Acting and then permanent Administrator, Wright served as Senior Vice President for Corporate from 1998-2000. He was Manager of BPA's Washington, D.C., office between 1990 and 1998 and Manager of the California office between 1987 and 1990. He started his career at BPA in 1981 in the conservation office. On October 1, 2007 the Inuvik Boot Lake electorate supported Mr. Roland for a fourth consecutive term as a Member of the 16th Legislative Assembly and on October 18, 2007 he was elected Premier of the Northwest Territories.

Mr. Roland served on the Inuvik Town Council for three years, including a term as the Deputy Mayor from 1994 to 1995. He was Chairman of the Inuvik Hunters and Trappers Committee from June 1994 to October 1995, and President of the Western Arctic Tourism Association. Mr. Roland has been actively involved with hockey in Inuvik, both as a minor league coach and as a player.

Mr. Roland and his wife Shawna have five sons, Austin, Justin, Quincey, Samuel, Mitchell and one daughter, Courtney.

#### **US Geothermal**

Boise, Idaho Monday, 2:00 pm - 5:00 pm

#### **Overview:**

US Geothermal is directed at working to responsibly develop geothermal energy resources for electrical power and direct uses. They strive to create enhanced value for their stakeholders while addressing America's domestic energy needs and promoting a clean environment.

US Geothermal and Ormat Technologies will make a presentation on their Raft River project and present a model of the power plant used at the project. The Raft River geothermal project is located in southern Idaho, approximately 200 miles SE of Boise and is the first commercial geothermal power plant in the Pacific Northwest. The power plant is an organic ranking (binary) cycle that was designed and constructed by Ormat Technologies.

US Geothermal currently owns and/or leases approximately 10.8 square miles of land with a proven geothermal reservoir which may be capable of producing up to 110 megawatts of power based on estimates from GeothermEx Inc. In an earlier study Raft River was rated first in the "Final High Temperature Ranking: Pacific Northwest" of geothermal sites in the four state Pacific Northwest region. Geothermal electric power plants typically have operating availabilities of 96% or higher and function as base load power generators, which is higher than hydro dams, coal and natural gas fired generators.

After the presentation attendees are invited to tour a facility using geothermal direct heat to see it in action. The tour will be led by Kent Johnson the geothermal manager for the city of Boise. Mr. Johnson will discuss "district heating" with regard to the Boise system which is the oldest and largest in the US.









