












Western Province Partnerships

- Western AIS Agreement
 - BC, AB, SK, MB, YK
- Working Group
 - AIS Coordinators from each province/territory
- Watercraft inspection/decontamination training
- Public awareness
 - consistent messaging (Clean, Drain, Dry)
- Standardized protocols
 - inspection, decontamination, lake monitoring
- Rapid Response planning and preparedness
- New detection tool(s) development
 - detection dogs, passport, eDNA, expanded operations









Increase Pesticide Control Options for AIS

- Pesticide registration is a federal process in Canada
 - Currently limited products available for use in AIS control
- AIS control requires immediate response and limited pesticide options available
- Need:
 - Establish a federal process that extends registration of known pesticides to control AIS
 - Establish a process for registration of new pesticides for AIS control









Increase Pesticide Control Options for AIS

- Best Management Practices for boating industry
- New protocol under development targeting newly manufactured boats
 - Currently new boats still being tested in high risk waters
 - Change procedure to testing in low risk waters and documentation protocol to streamline inspections
- Looking to amplify the Clean, Drain,
 Dry message with industry







Canadian Border Services Agency

Federal Fisheries Act – AIS Regulations

- •Prohibition on *Dreissenids*, Asian carp
- Canadian Border Services Agency collaboration
 - Ports of Entry, Transport Form
- No release of non-indigenous species

"Cross Border Transport Form"

- •All boaters fill out risk, contact info, etc.
- •CBSA emails each day
- We decide if follow up required
- •3/6 Ports of Entry covered (prov Inspection stations); direct boaters to our stations













WATERCRAFT INSPECTIONS ARE NOW MANDATORY

Expect to be inspected - watch for watercraft inspections province-wide.

All watercraft including non-motorized are required to atop.

- Sent: AK=11, BC=10, SK=6








Alberta/BC Passport Pilot

- Frequent boaters only
 - Alberta/BC or between
- Expedite inspections
- Community based social marketing model
- 'Commitment form'
 - Clean Drain Dry
 - Stop at inspections
 - Pull the Plug
 - Survey at end of season
 - Lottery?
- Tablet questions (each time) on experience
- Evaluate efficacy at end of season
 - Enhance boater experience, triage risk

Secret Boater Exercise

- Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, BC
- Mimic high risk boat moving across provinces
- Paint 'story' across boundaries
- Secret boaters exercise (go over criteria, what story looks like across boundaries – trigger mang action and have same scenario/same boater (ONT – BC).
- Same individual to evaluate all provinces (consistency in approach)
- Scenario used should trigger management action
 - High risk inspection;
 - Quarantine; and/or
 - Decontamination
- First impression, steps taken, messaging information provided, 'clean drain dry,' etc.
